# ACP PROGRAM OF CLINICAL AND THEORETICAL STUDIES

#### Introductory Course in Psychoanalysis

The introductory program runs for two semesters. Students will be introduced to concepts that lie at the heart of psychoanalysis. The course is both theoretical and practical, with an emphasis on the famous case studies that Freud used to introduce his discovery of the unconscious. It also explores the conceptual fameworks that different schools of psychoanalysis have used to construct models of intervention.

Psychoanalysis is both a body of theory and a clinical praxis. It also has a powerful research function. All these will be touched upon in the course over the duration of the year. In one and a half hour, weekly seminars, the teaching will cover the basic ideas of psychoanalytic practice, and the way they are implemented in the clinic. As the source from which all psychotherapies derive, psychoanalysis aims most potently to produce truthful knowledge, and this will be a theme of the course, which is suitable for both those who intend to practice clinically, and others with a more general interest. Over the many years the course has been running, this seminar format has proved an accessible way to introduce psychoanalysis.

The course consists of 24 seminars over two semesters.

# Four Year Program of Studies

The four-year course aims at engaging participants in a systematic study of the key concepts of Freudian and Lacanian psychoanalysis. Particular emphasis is given to psychoanalytic ethics and practice. The program provides a firm theoretical foundation for those wishing to undertake training as a psychoanalyst with the ACP.

Three years of the course will run in 2017. The ACP will offer a new intake of the program, whilst continuing to run the second and third year of its current program.

The course runs over two semesters, each of fourteen weeks duration.

The **first year** of the program aims to introduce participants to the foundational concepts of Freud's work, the unconscious and the drive, their elaboration by Jacques Lacan and application in clinical practice. The **second year** focuses on the study of the fundamental psychoanalytic concepts of repetition and transference, alongside a rigorous study of Freud and Lacan's theories of psychopathology and clinical structures.

During the **third year**, students continue the study of psychopathology begun in the previous year and embark on a study of fundamental ethical questions linked to the clinical practice of psychoanalysis. This includes the concept of the analyst's desire and the contributions Freud and Lacan have made to the field of ethics.
